The importance of collaboration at school

Quality education requires a certain level of involvement and coordination between the various players in the educational community: teachers, parents, local and university partners, outside contributors, and support from the diplomatic post's educational and cultural services. A genuine culture of collaboration within and outside the school is therefore highly desirable.

First and foremost, the degree to which families interact with the school is of vital importance if the school is to function properly, and the participation of elected parents on the School Council is a strong commitment to collaboration.

Local partnerships need to be developed with cultural and educational establishments, such as the already active one with French universities, which enables future schoolteachers to receive on-the-job training by assisting teachers in their classroom practice. Starting this December, a new trainee from the University of Lille will be observing and participating in our teaching activities.

We will also have a visit from middle-school students from a school in Singapore as part of a school exchange program, giving us the opportunity to share work and play in a convivial atmosphere.

Finally, the collaboration of the cultural service of the diplomatic post will be invaluable for the EFLP, which will be organizing educational days on Plurilingualism in collaboration with the French Institute, the Ecole Normale Supérieure and the French department of the University of Luang Prabang,

It is this synergy of skills that will enable us to meet tomorrow's global challenges in terms of living together and citizenship, tolerance, the transmission of values of solidarity, cooperation and respect, and the evolution of teaching methods.

- Finally, as part of the Friday projects, the students began shooting their short film for the International Film Festival, an ambitious project carried out in the streets of Luang Prabang.

Our nursery is complete, and this week we're planting our vegetables, taking into account the compatibility of each plant: squash, zucchinis, melon, eggplant, coriander, broccoli and lettuce have been planted in our two vegetable patches.

Since the start of the Vendée Globe race on November 10, we've been regularly following the progress of the 38 skippers. This is an opportunity for the Cycle 3 class to discover the major geographical landmarks: meridians and parallels no longer hold any secrets for them!

On PRONOTE you can see:


- Your children's homework

The kindergarten program is organized into five learning areas:

1. Mobilize oral and written language.

- -This learning process is at the heart of kindergarten. Children learn to express themselves in the language of Molière, understand their own thoughts and those of their peers.
- -The child will discover the gestures of but also that sounds are linked to to words...





2. Act, express and understand through physical activity.

-Every day, children spend 30 to 40 minutes to physical activity. This physical develops not only motor skills, but also sensory

sensory capacities and spatial and motor spatial and motor intelligence.

3. Act, express oneself and understand through artistic activities (drawing, painting, music, etc.).

-Objective at the end of kindergarten: through visual arts and music, children will become awareness of art. They sharpen their curiosity express themselves in a more personal way.
